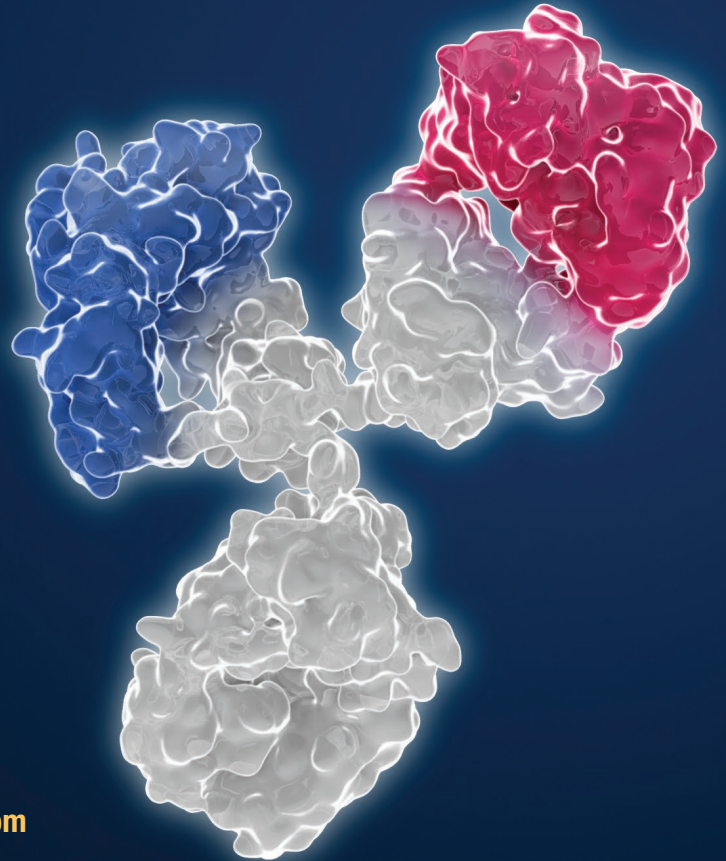

HIGH SCHOOL MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Regeneron recognizes the benefit to its own long-term scientific pipeline, as well as to the scientific community at large, of encouraging, inspiring, and training student scientists.

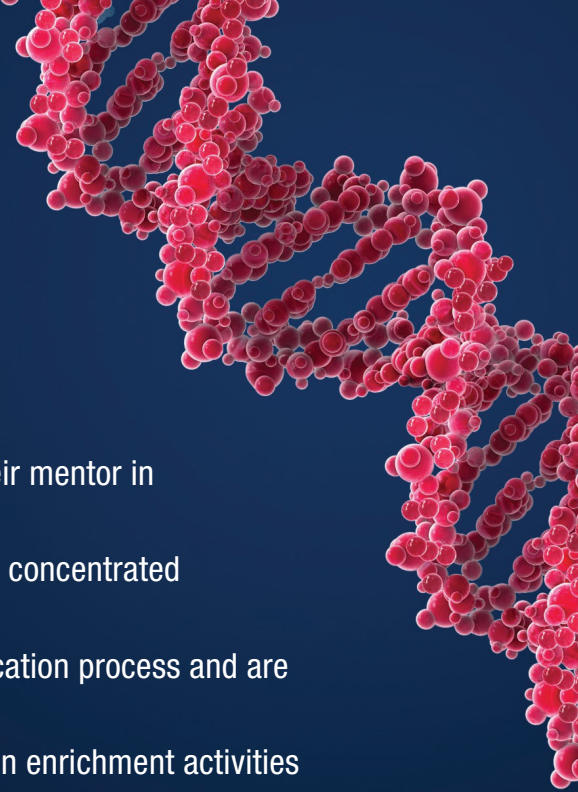
Regeneron supports its scientists in their efforts to mentor high school students who wish to engage in scientific research. Our goal is to provide students an opportunity to work with Regeneron scientists both inside and outside the lab to develop their scientific knowledge and critical thinking skills.

HIGH SCHOOL MENTORSHIP PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- Structured mentorship program where students are matched with a Regeneron scientist to conduct research at Regeneron full-time (40 hours/week) for 6-7 weeks during the summer.
- Students work on a research question they have formulated with their mentor in an industry setting.
- Program accepts sophomores for a 2-year program and juniors for a concentrated 1-year program.
- Students are invited to apply through a formal nomination and application process and are matched with mentors after a rigorous interview process.
- Students meet weekly with scientists and other students to engage in enrichment activities and didactic trainings.



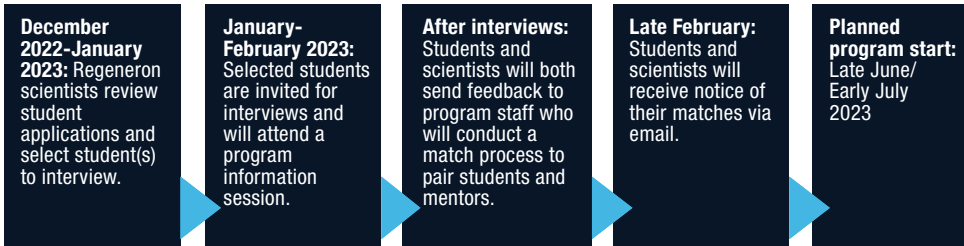
NOMINATION AND APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Deadline for students to apply for the summer 2023 program is Friday, December 9, 2022. Student applications received after this date will not be considered.

- › High school teachers may nominate their students beginning on Tuesday, November 1, 2022.
- › Teachers may nominate up to two students per school. If there are multiple science teachers, the school must coordinate nominations.
- › Deadline to receive teacher nominations is Thursday, November 17 to allow students time to complete the application by December 9.
- › Students from schools without science research programs may apply but must be nominated by a science teacher or school administrator.

- › All student applications, including the signed parental consent form, must be submitted no later than Friday, December 9, 2022.
- › Complete applications must include a resume or CV, two short essays, and a pre-recorded video interview.
- › Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted.

Regeneron uses a "matching" application process that is similar to those used for clinical internships and in many professional programs.
